<i>The following need to be in place prior to vaccinating children</i>			
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Can provide evidence of L2 child safeguarding training and L2 adult safeguarding training as determined by local policy. Online training is available at https://portal.e-lfh.org.uk/Dashboard and takes approximately 40 minutes for each element. 			
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Can identify Safeguarding Lead for Adults and Children is aware how to contact them. (Safeguarding lead may be on or off site). 			
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Is aware and knows how to access safeguarding guidance which identifies how to refer into MASH and Social Care and how to contact local designates 			
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Is aware of the Safeguarding App and the resources available within the App Details and links to the App can be found on the following link https://www.england.nhs.uk/safeguarding/nhs-england-safeguarding-app/ 			
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Can provide evidence that they have an enhanced DBS check against the adult and children's barred list in line with the workforce considerations for phase three. Evidence must be uploaded to the workforce platform.

<i>The following need to be in place prior to vaccinating children</i>			
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Must be competent in use of Gillick Principle- Consent modules are available on E-lfh if refresher are required https://portal.e-lfh.org.uk/Component/Details/564318 			
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Can demonstrate ability to undertake challenging risk/benefit conversations and dealing with more complex consent situations and has experience of managing children. 			

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Understands the importance of making a check to ensure children with severe neuro-disabilities who live in specialised residential settings have not received the vaccine already and if so, are both doses complete.

<i>The following need to be in place prior to vaccinating children</i>			
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> All vaccinators, are a paediatrically trained registered nurse, or another individual who can demonstrate NVQ L3-4(or equivalent RHCP) with evidence of working in a health care setting and giving IM injections to children and managing distressed children. Has received training in responding to psychogenic reactions such as fainting and dealing with challenging behaviours. 			
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Understand processes in place for ensuring children with special educational needs and disabilities (SEND) or physical disabilities receive an appropriate level of service and care for settings where this client group is being seen. 			
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Ensures reasonable adjustments are made for disabled children. Information is available at https://www.england.nhs.uk/learning-disabilities/improving-health/reasonable-adjustments 			
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Demonstrates consideration around managing disclosure from the child and for handling more sensitive topics such as questions around pregnancy and the privacy afforded by the physical space. 			
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Advises patient/carer on what to expect after vaccination as appropriate (e.g. local injection site reactions, fever) and management of these. Provides patient/carer with a copy of post-immunisation advice sheet or the product's Patient Information Leaflet if appropriate. 			
<i>The following needs to be in place within four weeks of commencement of children vaccines</i>			
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Demonstrates skills and competence to care for children with special educational needs and disabilities.

<i>The following need to be in place prior to vaccinating children</i>			
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> All clinical staff need to be trained and familiar with the management of anaphylaxis and understand the necessary dose of adrenaline. 			
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Be trained to a L2 standard in Paediatric BLS. Evidence to be uploaded to workforce platform. On line training is available at https://portal.e-lfh.org.uk/Dashboard and takes approximately 35 minutes to complete 			

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Must be trained in how to use the available defibrillator. <i>(public access defibrillator training is a 5 minute video).</i>

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Understand that children 16 to 17 years of age who are part of the clinical or other risk groups, as set out in the Green Book, should continue to be offered vaccination under the existing Patient Group Direction or National Protocol for the Pfizer BioNTech Covid-19 Vaccine. 			
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Understand that children within 3 months of their 18th birthday can be offered vaccination as part of the 18-29 years cohort under the existing Patient Group Direction and National Protocol for the Pfizer BioNTech Covid-19 Vaccine. Sites and Clinical Leads must be aware of this and be operationally prepared to implement this.
